Store Steers to £1900 Store Heifers to £1790

Big numbers still coming forward as we enter the usually quieter time of the year in the cattle pens.... But as they do say 'money will find them' with sellers taking advantage of the big leap in demand normally reserved for the new year. A really mixed bag, quality wise this week, although those poorer dairy bred sorts sold all as well in comparison to the many stronger beef types on offer. Steers topped out at £1885 and £1855 for pairs of grand British Blues (28m) from W and KJ Hill of Stockleigh Pomeroy with slightly younger Blues (24m) reaching £1770 for Mervyn Waye down from South Molton and £1480 for Toby and Beverly Boys from East Allington. Charolais steers (20m) up next when rising to £1810 and £1805 for Barry and Rachel Mildon and Family in from Cadbury with eye catching sorts, followed by a couple of well-bred and farmed Charolais bullocks (22m) at £1540 for Hubert Chugg of Stockleigh Pomeroy and later born ones (18m) looking well sold at £1420 apiece for a pen of five from David Skelley, Shaugh Prior. W and KJ Hill back when selling strong looking steers (25m) to £1770 for a trio of Limousins and Simmentals for £1750 whilst Ed Rhodes parted with a shapely Devon bullock for a creditable £1760 and further Limousin steers saw tremendous red yearling ease to £1265 for a pen of four from Phillip and Tom Cleave of Holne. Best of the British Blonde bred steers saw one from Mervyn Way (24m) draw £1670 followed by later born Blonde bullocks (18m) of high quality fetching £1360 for David Skelley whom also parted with a pair of solid looking Hereford bred steers (20m) for £1540 each. Several good runs of Aberdeen Angus bred bullocks on offer again this Friday with pairs (20m) from Dennis Turner of Wotter to £1565 and others (26m) realising £1540 for Russell Retter and family from Cotleigh whilst further native breed steers ran to £1480 for a bunch of four smart South Devons (22m) from Phillip and Richard Coaker of Postbridge. On to the store heifers which topped when Bary and Rachel Mildon and family parted with a pen of four super Charolais (20m) for a very decent £1720 a life whilst Phillip and Tom Cleave sold their best young (16m) Charolais to £1270. South Devon type heifers saw plenty of demand when reaching £1500 (20m) for the Rowland Family up from Plymouth together with one (29m) from Chris Lentern, Chagford which came back at £1420 whilst British Blue females (24m) ran to £1490 and £1455 for Graham Hawkins of Thorverton and Toby and Beverly Boys respectively. Other store heifer prices of interest included a trio of well summered Aberdeen Angus (24m) from Paul Rusden of Ideford at £1405, British Blondes (20m) selling for £1350 for David Skelley and Herefords (22m) drawing £1320 for the Rowland Family. Also, smart red Limousin females sold readily and to £1320m (20m) for Simon Jervis of Ideford whilst Phillip and Tom Cleave saw theirs rise to £1280 (16m).

A decent show receiving another pleasing trade. The sale included our 4th and final catalogued show and sale of suckled calves with once again quality being well rewarded. DC Turner up from Shaugh Prior presented Limousin cross steers (IIm) which topped out at £1210 with others to £1010. Ben Tristram & Family down from Wellington showed Limousin cross steers (8m) which topped out at £1150 with Charolais steers of a similar ilk to £1070. ST & AM Dennis Ltd across from Inwardleigh sold Limousin cross steers which obtained £1125 with further pens to £1095. GM Thorne & Son of St Giles on the Heath showed a cracking run of young suckled calves with the best topping out at £1090 (7m) with others to £990 and Charolais steers off the same good farm to £950. MA Stephens up from Plymouth presented Limousin cross steers (9m) which levelled out at £960 whilst the best of the dairy bred types saw Blue steers (12m) from Josh Webber of Yarcombe achieve £1045 with a second pen levelling out at £1000. David Pengelly & Son down from Cullompton yet again presented a wonderful run of suckled calves with the best topping out at £1020 for Limousin crosses (7m) with Blonde steers off the same farm to £960. Limousin cross steers (9m) from Terry & Jean Tall in from Modbury sold to £950 whilst well turned out young suckled calves from Martin Daw of Ugborough saw Charolais cross steers (5m) reach £940 with his second pen to £945. Best of the South Devon steers saw GO & CA Rowe of Dawlish realise £905 (9m) whilst a cracking run of dairy bred Blue steers from Johns Farm Ltd up from Newton Abbot raced to £900 (9m) with younger types to £820 & £740. David Pengelly & Son topped the heifer section with Blonde heifers (11m) obtaining £1020. ST & AM Dennis Ltd saw Blue heifers (13m) realise £985 whilst Limousin heifers from Ben Tristram & Family hit £975 (8m) with others to £880 & £860 (8m). GO & CA Rowe saw yearling South Devon heifers attain £855 whilst GM Thorne & Son saw their useful pen of 5 Limousin cross heifers (8m) level out at £830. Best of the dairy bred heifers saw Johns Farm Ltd top out at £790 with others to £775, £730 & £720 (8m). Martin Daw saw his young Charolais cross heifers (5m) hit £770 whilst Alison Collins of Diptford saw Simmental cross heifers (7m) achieve £720 & £700. All types, once again meeting good demand.

Heifers topped at £490 x 8 for a cracking group of weaned British Blue heifers from Johns Farms Ltd with young Blue heifers to £240 for Towhill Farm Ltd of Broadclyst and £220 for Roy & Katherine Emmett. Strong Simmental heifers sold to an exceptional trade topping at £410 with others to £405, £390 & £350 for Keith & Shirley Wotton and Charolais heifers also sold well to £300 & £280 for Frank Pike. Young Limousin heifers to £205 for Towhill Farm Ltd. Friesian bulls to £172 x 2 & £95 for Evershot Farms Ltd of Dorset and Ayrshire bulls sold to £113 & £84 x 2 for Messrs Nicholls of South Molton.

The dispersal sale of the Rosehill herd of 230 pedigree Ayrshires on behalf of Messrs WRC & JE Christophers of Truro saw a large crowd travel far and wide with buyers from Wales, Derbyshire, Scotland, Shropshire and across the Westcountry. Top of the day was the much admired "Rosehill Hawaiian Pamela VG87" a Pam Ayrs Hawaiian daughter bred from the Pamela family purchased from the Haresfoot Dispersal, she sold in a partnership between Jake Sayer & Ben Broadley. The next best milker was "Rosehill Pickle Phlache" a fresh third calver by Rosehill Mr Pickle, she sold at 2,600gns to Messrs Astley for their Sunshine herd in Powys. The same buyers also paid 2,300gns for another fresh second calver "Rosehill Very Mega Jiggy VG86" by Rosehill Megastar. Granddaughter Meg sold her own "Megarose Hawaiian Sapphire VG86", an August calved heifer by Pam Ayrs Hawaiian which had been successfully shown already. She sold at 2,300gns to James Warren & Family. Dry cows topped at 3,500gns for the much-admired show cow "Rosehill Pink Indianna VG88", this Rosehill Pink Floyd daughter was champion at Royal Cornwall this year and is due in January to Astorwell, she sold to Rob Higgins of Shropshire. Close behind was "Rosehill Panache Whiskey VG88" a second calver by Haresfoot Panache who was heifer champion at Royal Cornwall in 2023 and reserve breed champion this year. She sold to Nicola Bottom and Family of Truro at 3,200gns. In calf heifers topped at 3,800gns for "Rosehill Fantasy Magenta" by Hunnington Fantasy, she sold due in April to Ravenhill Revolver to Julian Walters of Okehampton. At 1900gns was a shrewd purchase for Phil & Stuart Williams for their Willhome herd in Pembrokeshire, "Rosehill Fantasy Verylight" is a daughter of Hunnington Fantasy sold due in April to Revolver. The same buyer also paid 2,100gns for "Rosehill Tokyo G Primrose" a daughter of the stunning Harrys Gold Primrose EX95 cow which had sold earlier in the dispersal. Heifer calves sold very well and topped at 2,500gns for David's show calf "Trerose Daring Babycham" sired by Troutbeck Daring out of three excellent dams, she sold to Sophia Warren who had successfully shown her as a calf for David. Many other calves sold between 500-800gns. The herd was a real credit to the Christophers Family and the following averages were achieved.
