A note from David Kivell

Another record breaking year for all the Kivells Machinery Team with over £5.2 million worth of machinery changing hands both at live auction and online, all to buyers from both ends of this country and across Europe.

A grand total of 25 auctions of machinery were carried out by the team, and more than 14,000 lots have been sold for all types of sellers from across the South West.

As 2022 progressed and with a change in management personnel the live sale and our timed online sale became ever more popular and large expectant crowds again became the norm. As increasing numbers of farmers looked to dispose of surplus kit as part of their forward planning, our onsite team has crossed the length and breadth of the South West in the last 12 months conducting sales of both modern and vintage machinery. With over £1 million worth of machinery sold via the onsite method it is clear that for many farmers this is increasingly becoming the auction style of choice.

The pandemic certainly accelerated change within many industries and as the conventional auction method was not possible throughout the multiple lockdown periods the timed online method has also proven to be a very efficient way to maximise the residual value of the machinery on offer. Purchasers have embraced this method and this coupled with Kivells own robust operating online platform via MartEye has resulted in some spectacular results.

Whilst on site sales by their nature have always been popular, allowing the farmer to keep all their own kit on farm until it is sold and avoiding having to transport it to our sales venues, we have certainly seen an increase and uptake in recent months. Our reach to social media via **facebook** has now extended to some 18,000 followers and continual updates and upgrades to our website particularly recently have ensured that our purchaser list continues to grow and our forthcoming sales fixtures also continue to expand.

Onsite Auctions

The onsite auctions remain a popular way of disposing farm plant and machinery quickly, efficiently and with complete transparency.

From the commencement of the sale catalogue to the clearance of the site following the sale the whole process can be undertaken in 4-6 weeks. It also retains the sense of occasion for those who are retiring from the industry.

With regular auctions across the South West, our dedicated team of auctioneers and administrators work closely with sellers and buyers to ensure a successful outcome. We promote auctions to our regular buyers database using this and our extensive auctioneering knowledge we are able to provide an efficient and effective service to both buyers and sellers.

Our experience and knowledge ensures sale proceeds are maximised and the whole auction is conducted in an efficient way. Our commission charges are flexible and competitive and we account promptly with the auction proceeds.

Timed Online Auctions

Our online timed auction service for agricultural machinery gives our clients the opportunity to sell surplus farm machinery and equipment via our online auction service run by **MartEye**. The service operates a no sale no fee basis and allows sellers to avoid the cost of expensive haulage to and from a collective auction.

Since the inception of our online auctions they have proven to be an extremely popular method of disposal of surplus equipment with minimum disruption to our client.

We host bi-monthly collective online auctions throughout the year but can also tailor individual auctions to specific needs and requirements of our particular clients. Each item will have its own detailed listing alongside a series of photographs and an optional video.

The auction runs over 5 days to a timed deadline, during which time buyers can access lots via our website or the **MartEye** website, arrange to view items and place their bid. At the end of the bidding period the item is sold, payment is made and the buyer collects the item directly from the seller.

What an amazing day! Over 500 registered bidders in the yard with another 1889 online bidders from countless counties in Great Britain all witnessing the biggest and best sale of machinery at Holsworthy.



Topping the day was the John Deere self-propelled harvester in from Barnstaple and going off to its new home near Ashwater at £69,000. Steve Johns of KEA Contractors of Falmouth on the South Coast of Cornwall had a wonderful dispersal and saw his 62 plate Fendt 828 reaching £68,200 going off to Exmoor, whilst his JCB handler hit £58,200 going to St Austell. The 17 plate Claas Axion sold to the Davison family of Tedburn St Mary at £68,000 whilst the pick of the 14 John Deere tractors powered to £46,000 going off to Stapleton in Yorkshire.

Following massive interest (64,880 views and 783 comments on **facebook**) the Claas Cougar raced away to £39,500 with the pick of the dispersal from Lark Plant being the Strautmann forage harvester reaching £36,000. The New Holland self-propelled sold well and went off to Tewkesbury in Gloucestershire at £35,000 with 2 other JCB handlers selling at £30,000 and £28,000.

Top call of the day was the pick of the dispersal on behalf of Brian & Helen Allin of Torrington (due to ill health) being the John Deere 6620 (04 plate) to £33,000 and going off to the edge of Dartmoor with the Dawe family. The same good farm sold their (N reg) 'Silver Same' 100 to £10,500 travelling to North Yorkshire.

Loyal vendors A & V Martin of Bratton Clovelly saw their 60 reg Landini c/w loader power on to £24,000 whilst the MF 390 (G reg) reached £13,200 with other Masseys hitting £7,500 on behalf of John Stanbury & family of Whitstone following Kivells selling the farm. The Valtra 900 tractor sold at £7,000 going home to Bideford whilst the Renault reached £6,450 going off to its new home up the M6. 14 tractors were sold on the day together with the 'aged' JCB handler from Geoff Bond of Langtree achieving £7,600.

South Newton Farm, Chittlehampton

Bathed in wonderful spring sunshine, Kivells were delighted to conduct the dispersal of tractors, machinery and goods on behalf of the Thorne family of South Newton Farm near South Molton, Devon. Having been lifelong clients of Kivells, we had the pleasure of selling the dairy herd, youngstock & beef animals as well as the farm itself.

Overall top call of the day was £63,000 given for the Lely astronaut robots and collars. Next up was the 67 plate Manitou handler which powered away to £50,000 & going off to its new home just outside Burford, Oxfordshire. The pick of the New Holland tractors raced to £41,500 and drove home to Ipplepen near Newton Abbot with John Ranjit.

Another huge entry of machinery & goods sold today from farms as far afield as Chepstow in Wales to Ashford in Kent.

A big day in this section which included something for everyone and a top call of £24,500 for the New Holland tractor in from Steve Thorne & family of South Molton. Next up was the slurry tanker in from Messrs Coles of Langtree at £11,600.







Brian Allin & family of Torrington conducted their dispersal which saw their Ford tractor hit £8,500 & going home to Honiton with Messrs Rew of Newton Abbot whilst the John Deere combine harvester reached £6,000 & powering off to Little Torrington with Mike Watkins.

Tony Kennedy of North Cornwall sold his 2 Polaris Rangers well at £6,000 each, closely followed by the mobile cattle race at £5,300 on behalf of Quicks Dairy Farm of Exeter.

A fantastic line up of Romany Gypsy goods & equipment topped at £9,000 for the Gypsy waggon on behalf of the treaties of the late Cissy Orchard with the pick of the 10 horse carts & gigs to £1,400 for the same owner.

A very well attended day in the central section of the sale which included three large dispersals from Devon & Cornwall attracting a very large crowd of supporters and bidders who were met with wonderful sunshine at Holsworthy for the whole of the day.

Top priced item in this section was £30,000 for a Valtra T190 with log trailer. A John Deere 5820 sold for £19,500 on behalf of the Marshall family from Shebbear, a John Deere 6800 sold for £15,600 from a local vendor, the same vendor selling another John Deere 6310 at £15,400.







Brian Allin and family of Torrington conducted their third dispersal with his Renault TX 155.54 making £14,200 and going home to Carmarthen in Wales. His John Deere 6100 made £13,800 heading towards North Yorkshire with his Pottinger Novadisc 262 mower making £2,600.

Sue Carter was the second dispersal of the day with her Landrover County 110 making £9,500, the Landrover County 90 achieving £8,000 and a Ford compact tractor at £3,900.

Another levely line up of travelling wagons and carts sold to £4,000 for the Orchard family.

Other machinery included a 2003 Takeuchi TB175 7.5 ton Excavator which made £10,800 followed by a very tidy Graham Edwards 12ft livestock trailer achieving £3,800. A Welgar AP45 small baler from Bradworthy reached £2,300 followed by a Malone post driver to £2,000.

went under the hammer for £9,000 and a very nice and recently restored David Brown 990 reached £3,500.

Brian Allin & family of Torrington had their fourth dispersal with a total of 2 tractors and 8 trailers selling to a top of £5,000 for a Marshall QM11 trailer.



Hartnoll Barton, Muddiford

A traditional on farm dispersal of livestock and machinery from Mr & Mrs John and Julie Dyer of Barnstaple, who have been farming at Hartnoll Barton for 51 years saw large crowds of prospective buyers from throughout Devon and Cornwall present and a very strong trade met throughout.

Machinery & farm equipment offered online bidding via MartEye and saw a top call of £19000 for a 5455 Massey Ferguson tractor complete with loader, 4000 hours. A Massey Ferguson 390 tractor and loader sold exceptionally well at £15,500 with the Krone tedder to £3,500 and bale trailer to £3,200.

Attendance on the day was slightly down from normal, but overall a good sale with MartEye helping to achieve some pleasing prices.

A McCormick MTX 150 with Quicke loader which achieved the top price of the day of £17,000 and a last minute entry JCB 1.6 ton mini digger achieved £12,200.

There was a French imported 1990 Ford 7810 Series 3 went under the hammer for £12,000 and a very straight 2015 JPM plant trailer made £9,000.

Ashfield, Trengune

A sunny day at Ashfield, Trengune met a large crowd of buyers and supporters to witness Peter Dymond's collection of vintage tractors, tools, parts and equipment sell to a top call of £3,500.

Peter was a well respected agricultural engineer with 40 years experience based at Trengune. This resulted in a large turn out of buyers and local support for the sale which helped with its great success.

Top call of the day was £3,500 for Peter's much loved BMC Mini Tractor followed by his Nuffield Universal selling for £1,800 with another at £1,000.

Peter had a very impressive collection of workshop contents, tools and spare parts and was sold as a 'shed full' on the day with the best of the spares reaching an impressive £1,450 and £600.







Linscott

A super day in the machinery field at Linscott Farm on behalf of Mr J Andrew saw a large crowd of buyers with plenty of local and neighbouring support for the sale.

The sale also saw a large following on **MartEye** with the top price piece of machinery selling online, being John's Landrover Defender 110 realising £6,400 and going to its new home in Wiltshire. Other items from John realised £3,700 for a 2010 John Deere rear mounted mower, £2,800 for an 8 tonne Norton Grain Trailer, £2,600 for a Maschio Power Harrow and £2,500 for an older Ruscon Tanker.

Outside entries were also welcomed at the sale and saw a John Deere compact Tractor (4049M) realising £4,200 with a JCB ground hog at £1,900 and £1,500 for an umbilical pipe realer.





Bolitho, Liskeard

Kivells held the Annual Bolitho Sale of machinery and goods at Liskeard. A fantastic entry of both machinery and goods was seen with a huge crowd of buyers and on lookers both present at the sale and on MartEye. Quality entries sold and spirited bidding from purchasers resulted in a very successful day in the sale field. A very pleasing clearance of 86% saw the top call of f,5,100 for a Roland's trailer followed by an air seed drill making f,3,900 looking very well placed. A side spread muck spreader made an impressive £2,500 achieving way passed vendors expectations with older cattle trailers to £1,100 and quad bike trailers to £600. Smaller items such as Bateman creep feeders to £480, sheep shedding gates to £210 and round feeders sold to £190.

The highlights included a 2018 Fendt 724 in from a local contractor made the top price of the day at £83,000 and a tidy John Deere 6125R sold for £36,000. We had another John Deere 7700 in from mid-Devon that achieved £17,500. A Case 1294 up from Cornwall went under the hammer for £3,400 and a John Deere Gator requiring engine repairs achieved £2,500.

The clouds parted and the sun shone on a big crowd of buyers, onlookers and sellers who descended on Colmer View Farm, California Cross by kind permission from Jim Winzer for Kivells second annual collective sale of Machinery.

This year's sale included the dispersal of Tractors, Farm Machinery and Cattle equipment on behalf of Robert & Christine Steer of Woodland Barton, Avonwick which got the sale off to a great start.

The highlight of their dispersal was the 2004 reg. Same Silver 100.4 4WD tractor that has done just over 7000hrs and realised £11,000 to a new home just outside of Exeter. Their other Same, an Explorer 90 II Top with MX80 loader had done over 10,500 hours and was described as requiring attention sold to an online bid of £7,100 heading north to Yorkshire. The couple also exhibited some nice pieces of well-maintained machinery that sold readily and often ahead of prices paid for the kit new over recent years, as buyers appreciated the rise in inflation and that purchases made today were ready to use tomorrow. This included the Warwick 24ft bale trailer, in very good condition for its age of 15, it stayed within the parish following a bid of £5,100, similarly the 5yo Marshal 9 cube rotary spreader rose to £4,400 heading to Newton Abbot and the Browns spring tine harrows head to Kingsbridge for £2,100. Amongst Robert & Christine's cattle equipment both the Cattle crush at £780 and the six heavy duty Cattle hurdles at £900 go to form the basis of a new cattle rearing enterprise on the outskirts of Exeter.

The sale also provided Clive and Gill Venables of Harford with an opportunity to disperse their collection of mainly sheep equipment and related items collected over many years of sheep farming at Hall Farm, as they look to relocate locally for their retirement. The many lots of sheep handling equipment met with great interest both in the field and on-line which saw the race sell to £620 with several other smaller lots £200 to £380. Their Samasz mower made £520, shearing equipment sharpener realised £300, rotovator made £650 and the highlight of their sale was Clives Honda scramble bike that made £900.
